
## Sonia Marcus University of North Carolina at Asheville

#### COMPOST!

In the 2013-2014 school year, UNC Asheville composted 98 tons of food waste.

This offset carbon emissions equivalent to 12 acres of tree planting.


2014 Waste Stream Analysis: Ramsey Library



65% of materials in trash were compostable




14% of materials in trash were recyclable

90% of students reported a better understanding of recycling after living in UNC Asheville residence halls





Last year, our campus recycled over 11,452 gallons of grease and oil from our dining halls. These materials were filtered and reused in biofuels and animal feed.

In the Spring 2015 semester, UNC Asheville collected an average of 11.8 tons of all-in-one recyclables every month.



That means, every month, we collected bottles, cans, cardboard, and paper wieghing as much as two adult elephants!

From December 2014- October 1, 2015 **4135** meals have been recovered from restaurants and caterers in Asheville.


