BLUE BAGS

Every RA will receive a labeled set of blue bags for their residents: one bag for paper and cardboard and one bag for bottles and cans. Please place these bags in the rooms during your initial room sweeps. RDs are provided with an additional set of ten bags for residents who need an extra bag. You can get more blue bags by submitting a work order.

CARDBOARD DUMPSTERS

First year students bring a lot of cardboard to campus when they first arrive. The Recycling Office provides large cardboard dumpsters to help collect this valuable resource.

These large cardboard containers arrive the Tuesday before move-in: one in the Randall/Monadnock courtyard, one on each side of Carle, one in the parking lot behind Holloway and one on the guad for Fiske & Huntress.

Eco-Reps and ROCKS workers will be stationed at each cardboard dumpster to encourage recycling and assist students and parents as they separate cardboard from their trash.

These cardboard dumpsters will be removed the Friday before upperclassmen move-in. At this time your residents should begin using the standard recycling and trash locations for their building.

WORK ORDERS

The Recycling Program is a part of Physical Plant just like Carpentry, Electrical, HVAC, Plumbing and Grounds. The program operates through the use of Service Requests or Work Orders. Your RD has the ability to submit work orders for your recycling requests.

Here are a few examples of requests you may have throughout the year:

ROCKS Additional Bin Needed

Use this request when you need an extra blue bag for a resident, if you need an extra bin for a cleanout or if you need a recycling bin for an event.

ROCKS Misc. Pick-Up

Use this request for things like broken TVs. minifridges, items for the Reuse Room and other assorted items that can be recycled!

ROCKS Bin Needs to be Washed

Use this request when a blue recycling toter needs to be washed in your recycling room or in the outdoor green sheds.

ROCKS Bin Needs to be Emptied

Use this request if the bins fill before your next scheduled pick-up. You received schedule information in the RA info envelope dropped off with your blue bags.

Did you know: Campus recycling programs are only available to on-campus students. Off-campus students can recycle for free at the local Recycling Center on Route 12 North.



WHO ARE WE?

Campus recycling is managed by the ROCKS Program: Recycling On Campus Keene State. The program consists of one full-time staff member and approximately 20 student employees. We service all 50 campus buildings at least once a week – and most res halls two or three times a week!

We can recycle almost anything!

- Paper, magazines, junk mail, note paper
- Plastic, glass, aluminum and steel bottles and cans
- Corrugated cardboard
- TVs, computers, cell phones, mini-fridges
- Cell phone chargers, cables, cords, wires
- Batteries, fluorescent bulbs
- Notebooks, folders, binders, books
- Clothing, bedding, shoes

SCHOOL SUPPLIES

There are two locations on campus where students can go year round to find school supplies and other gently used items:

- Reuse Room in Elliot basement
- ROSE Room in Media Arts Center Students, staff and faculty are welcome to bring gently used household goods, school supplies and home décor items to the Reuse Room.
